Prior to the Board meeting, the Shawnee Mission School District formally recognized student award-winners in the Shawnee Mission Area Council PTA Citizenship Writing Contest. **Horizons Announcement** Eleven students at Horizons were recently surprised with the news they have received scholarship offers through Scholarship Shawnee Mission. The Shawnee Mission Education Foundation announced the students had received a total of \$572,000 in

scholarship offers from Newman University. As you may remember, The Foundation launched this program in the fall. So far, more than 1,200 seniors have been presented with scholarship offers valued at more than \$735,000,000, not including this most recent announcement. Through the program, students are identified and recruited by colleges and universities around the country, making it easier for them to navigate the admission and application process.



**Mars Rover Name** Gabriel Matthew, a fourthgrader at Broken Arrow Elementary, was selected as a semifinalist in the Mars 2020 "Name the Rover" contest. His entry was selected as the Kansas winner in the elementary school category. He wrote an essay in support of the name

"Jeevan," which is a word that means "life." More than 28,000 essays were submitted by K-12 students in this competition. In 2009 it was a Shawnee Mission elementary student, Clara Ma, who won the Mars Science Laboratory naming contest. She named the rover "Curiosity."
